Good morning.

In reference to the case number BOA-23073, I have a couple of questions. I reviewed the materials online related to the Project Hardship and Design Rationale and it appears that the new structure will be located due west of the current structure, with a slight overlap of the west end of the building. I included a screenshot of the new design approximated and highlighted in green.

Will the existing Museum be completely razed for the build out of the proposed design and if so, will a plan to salvage and repurpose existing materials from the Museum, (i.e. native stone) be part of the project consideration?

My second question relates to the impact of the construction. Will there be an environmental impact study done prior to construction allowing for public consideration and comment?

Overall, the proposal looks to be a marvelous use of the available terrain and I do appreciate the benefits of the smaller design footprint, although the ravine that lies directly west of the Museum already sends a good deal of water into the Stuart Park land area, and over the years has caused erosion and damage to the Pre-Columbian Garden.
